As you prepare to come for your retreat, we invite you to be open and generous in your desire to spend these days with the Lord in quiet recollection. Please plan to arrive in time for dinner at 5:45 p.m. on the first evening of the retreat. The retreat ends with lunch on the last day. Mass is offered on all but the first day. Reservations for all directed retreats must be made at least one week before the start of the retreat.

By automobile: from the west take the Mass Pike (I-90) to I-95/ Rte. 128. Take I-95/Rte. 128 north to exit 26 (Rte. 20). Take Rte. 20 west, and after about a mile take a right at the first regular (not blinking) traffic light. After a short block, take a left and go through the small commercial center of Weston. Shortly after the center of town, look for Concord Road on the right. Follow Concord Road for about three quarters of a mile until the fork in the road. At the fork, go left and wind around up the hill for about half a mile. Campion Center conference & Renewal is on the right and our parking lot is on the left. From the north and south on I-95 (Rte. 128): Take exit 26 (Rte. 20) Follow directions above.

From Logan Airport: consider taking Massport's "Logan Express" to Framingham and then taking a taxi to Campion Center Conference & Renewal. The "Logan Express" runs on a regular schedule and stops at all airline terminals. The *Spiritual Exercises* (30-day retreat) October 3, 2020 to November 1, 2020

Individuals interested in making the Spiritual Exercises, the "long" or the "30-day" retreat, are expected to be in an on-going spiritual direction relationship and have made at least two eight-day silent retreats. Retreatants should plan to arrive between 9:00 and 3:00 on Friday October 2, 2020. The retreat begins the following day, Saturday, October 3, 2020 and ends with Eucharist on the morning of November 1, 2020, the Feast of All Saints. Retreatants are expected to be available for the entire period of the retreat. The spectacular autumn foliage for which New England is world-famous will provide retreatants with breath-taking natural beauty in which to deepen one's relationship with God.

The Spiritual Exercises in Everyday Life (19th annotation retreat)

Cost: \$850 Non-refundable application fee of \$50 and deposit of \$100 are required

This retreat is designed for those wishing to make the *Spiritual Exercises*, but who cannot make a full-time 30-day retreat. Experienced directors are available throughout most of the year for this retreat. Interested individuals should be in on-going spiritual direction and should have made individually directed retreats in the past. Most people take about 30 weeks to complete a 19th annotation retreat. Interview will be scheduled after applications are completed.

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
