

Autumn 2021 Protocols & Practices at Campion Center Conference & Renewal

- **Vaccinations** - All participants in Days/Evenings of Prayer and Retreats are fully vaccinated prior to arrival.
- **Confidentiality** - All personal information will remain confidential.
- **Rapid Test** - All participants in Days/Evenings of Prayer and Retreats are rapid tested by health care professionals upon arrival and at 3-day intervals depending on the length of their stay.
- **Screening/Temps** - All participants in Days/Evenings of Prayer and Retreats are screened for symptoms and temperature-checked once-a-day.
- **Masks** - Masks are provided and required in all public indoor settings.
- **Hand Sanitizing** - Frequent use of hand sanitizer is recommended.
- **Elevators** – When possible, retreatants use the stairs. There is one elevator in the building (just off the Rotunda). It is limited to three (3) masked individuals at a time. We share this elevator with the members of the Jesuit Retirement Community. Please be courteous and yield to the retired Jesuits. Elevators are disinfected, cleaned, and sanitized electrostatically twice each day.
- **Restrooms** – First floor restrooms are disinfected, cleaned, and sanitized electrostatically twice each day. Restrooms on the upper floors are disinfected, cleaned, and sanitized each day.
- **Meals** – Masks are worn in the buffet line. Please use hand sanitizer before going through the buffet line and use serving utensils. All Retreatant meals are eaten in the Auditorium across the Rotunda from the Main Dining Room. When possible, “grab & go meals” are provided with disposable food service items. Especially in the nice weather, meals can be eaten outside.
- **Mass** – Mass for retreatants is separate from the Jesuit Community. The Chapel is disinfected, cleaned, and sanitized electrostatically after each event. We do not hold hands during the Lord’s Prayer. We bow or use a head-nod at the Kiss of Peace. When receiving Communion, we receive the consecrated host and do not drink from the common chalice or dip the consecrated host into the common chalice.

Loving God, when we aren't sure, help us be calm.

When information comes from all sides, correct and not, help us to discern.

When fear makes it hard to breathe & anxiety seems to be the order of the day, slow us down.

Help us to love as perfectly as we can, knowing that "perfect love casts out all fear".
